#### **Elk Creek WELCA Meeting**

January 22, 2024

Stephanie opening meeting at 9:10 am with the Creed and Theme Verse. Treasurer's report given: December Income: \$1500.65, Expenses \$7,945.18 (includes ladies portion of the quarterly church utilities) Ending Balance \$3,245.17, Savings balance \$1,457.28. Report was accepted and placed on file.

Secretaries report was read. Correction made the add the amount of \$250 given to Ruth House, Bolten, Sojourner, and Beacon Houses. Amendment to the Lutefisk serving times beginning at 12:30, 2:00, 3:30, and 5 pm. Amendment also to the 2024 Alter Committee Tricia Lyngen (2 yr) for Crystal Johnson. Motion to approve by Stephanie, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tammy, passed.

#### **Old Business:**

Lutefisk Dinner discussion on additional advertising, will not use Arrow Shopper as they will not match AdDelite pricing. Will also use Volume1, TCC, WTCO, streaming on bank marquees. Will be adding pricing for children (5 and under free, 6-10 \$10.00, 11 and up full price) will also encourage the 5 pm setting as a family setting. Motion by Roseann, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tammy, passed. Currently ticket numbers: 44 @ 12:30, 30 @ 2:00, 9 @ 3:30, 5 @ 5:00pm.

#### **New Business:**

February Lenten Services; Light meal (6 pm) before service at 7 pm. Ash Wednesday, no meal. Will put a signup sheet to serve in Narthex. Checking with Jan on flowers, and Crystal for Ashes needed for Ash Wednesday. Checking if Youth are planning a breakfast for Palm Sunday. Ladies will not be doing one if not done by Youth.

Linda proposed getting an I-Pad with a keyboard for Ladies to do the Treasurer bookkeeping/report on, would also us to house Minutes, and annual ladies booklet, various information such as Lutefisk Dinner, Bazaar, Church in the Barn information. After discussion motion by Tammy for Linda to work with Matt Weaver on this and given approved spending up to \$1000. Motion 2<sup>nd</sup> by Roseann and passed.

Motion by Linda to change the meeting to the first Sunday of the Month at 9am (until service time changes in June, then will have after the service). Lori seconded this, motion passed. The 2024 Ladies books were distributed to those in attendance by Lori. Will have 2 serving groups this year alternating the big events/meals.

Stephanie brought forward needs of a local Veteran. Will check further into bills he may need assistance with. Motion by Tammy to give up to \$200.00 to assist with bills. Prefer to pay on the bill rather than give money. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Lori, motion passed.

#### Elk Creek Lutheran Church Council Meeting -- January 2, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Ryan Johnson at 7:00 PM. Members present were: Jan Berg, Mark Blabac, Brian Christopherson, Ryan Johnson, Anson McCune, Lori Nelson, and Stephanie Rumstick.

Prayer -- Ryan began by opening with a prayer asking for guidance for the Council and the congregation.

**Secretary's Report --** It was noted that the Secretary's Report for December of 2023 had been sent to each of the Council members electronically, corrections made, and it had been approved prior to it being printed in the January Newsletter.

**Financial Report --** was presented by Anson with information provided by Haukeness Financial Service. It was noted that we will be receiving a check from the Joint Parish account for the final balance amount and that we will need to submit one as per the Parish Agreement. Brian made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented; Mark seconded; motion passed.

**WELCA Report** -- Jan and Stephanie noted that planning has begun for the February 17 Lutefisk Supper and that the Women's Group has recently given away money earned from the Bazaar and other events to many causes and charities.

Choir, Memorial Committee, Youth Group, Sunday School, Custodian, Office Staff, and Joint Parish Council – No Reports

#### Old Business -

- Parsonage Ryan indicated that the water heater at the Parsonage had broken and was leaking. He contacted Semingson Aberle Plumbing LLC which installed a new water heater. It was noted that Matt Weaver and Jim Odness are planning to remove the Stair Lift. Jan made a motion to list the old water and the Stair Lift on Google Marketplace; Stephanie seconded; and the motion passed. Lori noted that before we can rent out the parsonage, we need to have a railing installed on the stairs in the breezeway. This would reduce our liability in the event of any future accident. Ryan will look into getting this constructed.
- Thank you Ryan expressed a Thank you from the Council to Lori Nelson and Tammy Danenberg for organizing the morning service on Christmas Eve.
- **Computer** Ryan indicated that a computer had been ordered to replace the church's broken one. For various reasons, the computer had been ordered using Ryan's credit card. Brian made a motion to reimburse Ryan for the cost of the computer; Lori seconded; and the motion passed.
- Pastor Paul Tobiason's Schedule It was noted that Pastor Tobiason had requested to take one Sunday off per month. Since Immanuel will be having Communion on the first and third Sunday of each month, Pastor Tobiason's Sunday off will be on the second or fourth Sunday of each month. Matt Weaver has agreed to lead services on the Sundays when Pastor Tobiason is unavailable.

- Basement Carpet Ryan indicated that a suggestion had been made about having the carpeting in the basement professionally cleaned. Following discussion, it was recommended that it not be professionally cleaned until after the Lutefisk Dinner. The issue was tabled until the March meeting.
- Painting of the Narthex It was noted that the Council had earlier approved having Allen Rongstad paint the narthex when he had time available. Since he now had the time, he was asking about the selection of the new paint color for the Narthex. Council members felt that Allen should be in charge of determining this.
- 2024 Budget Anson presented the proposed 2024 Budget. Following discussion, Mark made a motion to approve the proposed 2024 Budget and to present it at the Annual Meeting; Brian seconded; and the motion passed.

#### New Business -

- Offering Envelopes / Folders Ryan noted that Crystal Johnson had found some offering envelopes and folders and would be putting them out for church members to take. Lori made a motion to authorize Crystal or order additional generic weekly and month Offering Envelopes; Stephanie seconded; and the motion passed. It was noted that the placing of an envelope or two in with the hymnals in each pew might encourage donations as well as make it easier for the Financial Secretary to keep track of all donations made by members since currently cash donations are not attributed to any individuals.
- Bills Custodian Lindsey Nelson had submitted a bill for replacement parts for a vacuum. Matt Weaver needed to be paid for leading services on December 31. A bill should be arriving very soon from Semingson Aberle Plumbing LLC for the replacement water heater at the parsonage. Stephanie made a motion to pay each of these bills[Brian seconded; and the motion passed.
- Thank you A Thank You from Crystal was read for her Christmas present and for the raise in her annual salary.
- Heating / Cooling System The current heating and cooling system of the church was discussed. Currently the Sanctuary and the dining room in the basement have programmable thermostats, but the narthex, offices, classrooms, and basement hallway do not. This means that each Sunday morning when there is Sunday School, Allen or Becky Rongstad go to the church around 5:30 AM to set the other thermostats so that everyone is comfortable in those rooms by the time they are needed. The installation of alternative thermostats was discussed. Anson was directed to check with an electrician about automating the heating / cooling system and any other systems.

**Next Meeting** – The next Council meeting will be on February 6 at 7 PM.

**Adjournment** – Lori made a motion to adjourn; Anson seconded; motion passed. The meeting was closed at 8:50 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

Lines from LaVerne... Let's go way back to the beginning. You learn how God spoke creation into existence. He took time to create an idyllic place before he created humans to live there with each other and their creator. God could have created the whole world in one day and everything at once. He created just so much each day, and then he rested. He doesn't need rest, but he chooses to rest. Before there was some, there was nothing, but there was someone, God. He has always existed, and he always will. From out of the depths of love, he created our world. He created human last. Perhaps, because he figured we would try to tell him what to do and how to do it. One thing is very clear, he didn't need our help. But humans are unique and special among God's other creatures. They bear the image of God and we're valued above all of the other creatures. The greatest call of the Christian life is to know God, thank God for his many blessings and help others to know him too.

God decided Adam, whom he had made of dust should have a companion, so he created Eve. These two humans were to live in a beautiful garden. They lived and had the work of managing the garden. There was just one rule. Don't eat the fruit of this one tree. How hard is that? Being sinful like us, old Satan got to them, and they did eat fruit from that tree. The first disobedience toward God, which created a curse as result. Because God was to rule over them. They had this rule, as a reminder that God was in charge. They had lived in unbroken intimacy with God, with each other, and with the world around them. It was an idyllic existence. But

they couldn't seem to stand it. Who does that remind us of? Genesis is written to remind us of what has happened, what God has done and how he has interacted with his presence of human history.

Just think how wonderful this world is. We have four seasons, every year, and the world keeps running. If the creation is this amazing, think how amazing the creator must be. The creator always has the right to determine what becomes the creation. The creation story reveals some of the things that he values. Creativity balanced with order and design. God does not create things willy-nilly. There's a structure to his creation process. He takes his time with no need to hurry. He doesn't waste time, but he is not a slave to the clock. It seems God prefers a rhythm of work and rest to a demanding work schedule. He created just enough each day, and then he rested. He isn't tired, but he chose to rest. He values rest as much as he values work. Humans were special, and they bare the image of God.

Above everything, God values, he seems to prize community. He steps back declares everything is good, but he noticed that Adam should not be alone. So he created Eve and brings a new creation to the garden, the creation of community. In our work, we should rest as well, even if we don't think we need rest. We need to fight for the rights of the unborn and the elderly. Aid to the needy, water for the thirsty, companionship to the lonely and loving our neighbors. God values humans. God rested, and you should too. Have friends over for dinner, enjoy their company. Let them know you value their friendship. Do something for a stranger. Do something out of your comfort zone, volunteer in a soup, kitchen, council, and mother. Show others how much you agree with God that human life and human dignity are worth working for to preserve. Whatever you were doing remember this, it's all worship. The reason you were able to think, speak, walk, draw, plan, rest, breathing, work is because there is a God, who created you for purpose. Oh, Lord, my God, you were exalted above all things we can conceive, or imagine.
