Old Business

1. Ben Aiona has installed the air conditioner at the parsonage not sure if we have received a bill yet.
2. At the special congregational meeting on Sunday June 2, 2019 by unanimous vote Bjorkstrand roofing was approved to replace the roof and the color selected was Cyprus (red with black).
3. Trees are growing on the mound system, this will need to be taken care of. Jim will contact Leonard Robinson to see if he might have a brush hog that could be used.
4. Becky shared that the organ speaker is making noise again, Keith looked at it, but it continues to happen. Jim will get a piece of carpet and place this under it. Seems it only happens when playing the low G and Becky feels it is related to the organ. We did have this looked at in the fall of 2018 and may have to have it looked at again.
5. Discussion regarding the appropriateness/legality of employees, (janitor, church secretary and organist) being paid as a 1099 vs. W-2. Linda will contact Hawkness Tax Service to determine the legality of 1099 vs W-2 for the

- following employee's janitor, church secretary and organist and share information at the next meeting.
6. Discussion regarding music for "Church in the Barn Service" as well as a possible speaker. Tom shared that Crystal is looking into this with information forth coming.
 7. Jim provided information about having our offering envelopes printed locally rather than using a company. Pastor shared that Strum prints their offering envelopes and perhaps contacting Michelle Peaslee to see if some arrangements could be made with them

New Business

1. Jim contacted Bjorkstrand roofing and confirmed the amount due for project at \$29,200.00 as well as the color. Mr. Bjorkstrand shared that we will need to pay 30% (8760) of the bill prior to starting the project, another 30% (8760) when the project begins and the remaining balance at the completion of the project. Once down payment and necessary paperwork is received it will be approximately 6 weeks before the project would begin. Discussion held regarding which fund to take it from and whether or not money offered by the ladies would be needed. Keith made a motion to take the first 30% (\$8760.00) payment from the church savings account, second by Becky, motion carried. Regarding the money offered by the ladies it looks like that will be needed, with plan for payment yet to be determined.
2. Pastor shared that there is some damage to the rain gutter above the air conditioner as a result of the winter weather. He was wondering about the tractor tire and the light in the front yard of the parsonage.
3. Brad contacted Keith and Brad is resigning his position as Janitor for the church as of July 31, 2019, he has been the janitor since he was 17 so over 20 years. Brad would like to continue to mow grass at the church. We are currently looking for a janitor. If interested please contact a council member or member of the Personnel Committee which include Tim Radaatz, Linda Odness and Brandi Berg.
4. The elevator has been inspected and passed.
5. We will begin printing the amount of money received through Thrivent Choice Dollar delegation by those members who have that option. No names will be printed, just the amount so we can all see the benefit this option provides the church.
6. Some of the landscaping at the front of the church needs to be removed and replaced, Jim is checking with Smith Landscaping for recommendations, with future plans for completing this project
7. Jerriann Thronson has requested transfer of her membership to Saving Grace Lutheran Church in Eau Claire. Council has directed Pastor to proceed with this request.
8. The on demand hot water heater needs repairing with a cost of at least \$500.00. Discussion held and it was decided to table the repairs for now, turn on the big hot water heater all the time and see how that works.
9. Due to the church being locked a few times over the past few months additional keys for the front door are now available if needed. The following individuals have a key should you need access in the event the church is locked: Current President (Jim Odness), Bonnie Johnson, Brad Johnson, Pastor Ahles and Becky Rongstad.
10. The side entry door lock by the bathroom addition is also being replaced.
11. We received a letter from Trempealeau County regarding an inspection of the parsonage septic tank. Jim will contact Chimney Rock Septic to complete the necessary paperwork and send to the county.

Motion to adjourn made by Keith 2nd by Linda, motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 9:26, we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

There are also some areas on the roof that are leading, near the steeple and on the south east side so these will need to be fixed at the time of the replacement, so this may increase the cost. Mike Nelson made a motion to replace the roof using Bjorkstrand Roofing and the council should spend whatever it cost to have it done correctly, seconded by Jan Berg, motion carried. Each member was provided with a paper ballot and the proposal was approved unanimously and the color selected was red.

Motion to recess was made by Tammy Danenberg, seconded by Stephanie, and motion approved.
